

Georgia students travel by train to visit Sweet Briar College in Virginia


ast year, a group of 19 students and two counselors from Kendrick High School in Columbus, Ga., traveled by Amtrak to visit Sweet Briar College, a small private women's college in Virginia. The experience was an adventure for many of the young women, who had never before been on a train and who were just beginning their college search.

The group arrived at the Lynchburg train station, just a 25-minute drive from Sweet Briar. Sweet Briar Admissions customized the visit to the students' interests.
